Innovative Practices in the department of anaesthesia

- 1. The **McKenzie technique** is a method for topicalization of airway with local anesthetics for awake intubation which include securing airway with conventional laryngoscope, using fiber-optic bronchoscope & video laryngoscope.
- 2. Sequential Ultrasound imaging technique for interscalene approach to Brachial plexus.
- 3. Use of **infraclavicular brachial plexus** block to provide surgical anaesthesia & analgesia of the arm below the shoulder (making it useful for patients with limited shoulder mobility).
- 4. **Maclean's technique** for spinal anaesthesia proved as a novel & useful technique where the patients are not able to flex their lumbar & thoracic spine.
- 5. **Bilateral cooled radiofrequency** (Demo machine) was used for 4 patients with chronic osteoarthritis of knee.
